

St. Peter's Church, Salisbury, MD
CUSTOMARY FOR ACOLYTE/CRUCIFER
AT SUNDAY 9AM HOLY EUCHARIST (10AM SUMMER)

Before the Service:

1. Arrive at least 15 minutes before the service
2. Vest in red cassock (black cassock during Lent). Do not wear cotta when lighting candles
3. Ten (10) minutes before the service, light candles as follows:
 - a. Enter the church and at the communion rail, bow at the altar. Retrieve the candle lighter from its stand on the right near the chairs, return to the sacristy to light it. (Exception: during Eastertide, the candle lighter should be lit from the flame of the Paschal Candle at the altar)
 - b. Return to the altar. Bow then move up the steps to light the Eucharist Candles: epistle side first (right) then Gospel side second (left).
 - c. Light the Office Candles (candelabras) on the altar: epistle side (right) branch, inner to outer; then Gospel side (left) branch, inner to outer.
 - d. Finish by lighting credence table candles (right then left).
 - e. Extinguish the flame and place the candle lighter back in its stand.
 - f. Step down at the communion rail, bow at the altar
 - g. Return to the vesting room.
4. Vest in cotta and place acolyte cross around neck and put on a pair of white gloves.
5. Assemble with the altar party five minutes before the service begins.
6. At the direction of the Celebrant, lead the altar party to the back of the church. The Acolyte/Crucifer leads the procession followed by the choir/band if present, the Eucharistic Ministers and any ordained clergy (such as the Celebrant).

During the Service:

1. Process towards the altar at the start of the second verse of the opening hymn (or wait until the Celebrant tells you to go) then slowly start the procession, walking at a slow pace toward the altar.
2. At the communion rail, pause briefly (do not bow) then turn toward your left to place the processional cross in its holder at the end of the choir pew near the organ. Go to the opening at the gate, bow at the altar then move toward the chairs on the right side of the altar and stand in front of chair next to the credence table. You may take off your gloves if desired. Pick up worship bulletin from chair and follow the service.

3. During the Sequence Hymn the Gospel Reader (usually the Deacon or Celebrant) comes to take the Gospel Book from the altar. Once the Gospel Reader bows before the altar and moves toward the Gospel Book, proceed to the communion rail and stand in the aisle at the choir pews, back facing the congregation. Keep your hands folded. The torch bearers (if present) will take their torches and stand outside the communion rail between you and the rail.
4. When the Gospel Reader has turned and started down the altar steps with the book, bow before the altar, turn and slowly lead the Gospel procession down the aisle to the nave, hands folded. The torches will be behind you on either side of the Gospel book bearer.
5. Stop at the second pillars, turn and face the altar. The Gospel Reader will open the book and hand it to you to hold at eye level.
6. When the reading is finished, the Gospel Reader may take the book, close the book and hand it to you. After the Gospel Reader steps to one side, hold up the Gospel book and proceed up the aisle, the torch bearers (if present) walking on either side of you. Continue up the steps to the altar and lay the book on the cushion at the altar. Do not bow while you are holding the book. (Exception: if the Deacon is reading the Gospel, she will take the book back to the altar unless she is preaching in which case she will ask you to return the Gospel book to the altar.)
7. After the Gospel book is placed, move the Altar Book and Stand from the epistle (right) to the Gospel (left) side of the altar, to the left of the veiled chalice. (Exception: if the Deacon returned the Gospel book to the cushion, wait until she has left the altar before moving the Altar Book and stand.)
8. Come back down the steps in the center, bow and go to your seat on the epistle (right) side.

9. At the beginning of the Offertory Hymn, when the congregation stands, proceed with Deacon or Eucharist Minister, who will carry the large alms basin, past the Communion Rail, turn and bow with the Deacon/Eucharist Minister before the altar, then walk side by side to the top of the Chancel Steps. Your hands should be folded. Wait for the ushers to present the gifts. You should be on the left and the Deacon/Eucharist Minister should be on the right.
10. When the ushers arrive, take the ciborium in one hand and the wine cruet in the other hand from the usher (the Deacon/Eucharist Minister will take the offering plates from the other usher).
11. Return to the altar with the Deacon/Eucharist Minister. Since you are carrying the elements, do not bow, but proceed directly to the credence table.
12. Place wine next to water. Loosen the top of ciborium.
13. Hand ciborium to the Celebrant/Deacon with right hand. Retrieve top with left hand and return it to credence table. If additional bread is needed the Celebrant/Deacon at this time will ask for the square Bread Box. Hand Celebrant/Deacon the Bread Box. Celebrant/Deacon will return it to you when he/she is done for you to place it back on the credence table.

14. Place wine cruet in right hand, handle facing away from you. Hand wine to Celebrant/Deacon. Celebrant/Deacon may give you back the wine cruet – take it with your left hand, or the
15. Celebrant/Deacon may keep it on the altar for the consecration (this will be the case if there are two or more ministers administering the chalice). If additional wine is required, the Celebrant/Deacon will ask for it at this time. Additional cruet(s) of wine will be found on the Credence table. Hand them to the Celebrant/Deacon only if requested.
16. Place the water cruet in right hand, handle facing away from you. Hand water to Celebrant/Deacon. Retrieve water with your left hand and place on credence table.
17. Pick up the hand sanitizer and squirt some on the hands of the Celebrant. Return hand sanitizer to the credence table.
18. Take lavabo towel from credence table, drape over left forearm, open lid to water cruet and hold open as you take the cruet in your right hand. Then take lavabo bowl in left hand and offer to Celebrant. Pour a small amount of water over Celebrant's fingers then turn your body so the Celebrant can pick up the towel from your forearm. The Celebrant will use the towel to dry hands and then return the towel on your left forearm. Bow and then place towel, water and basin on credence table.
19. Take worship bulletin and stand in front of your chair.

Great Thanksgiving (stand)

20. When the congregation starts to sing the words "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord", move down to bottom step in front of altar before the sanctus bell, facing the altar.
21. After the Sanctus is finished, kneel on the cushion.

Fraction (kneel)

22. If there is more than one minister administering a chalice rise from your place when the Fraction Anthem begins and go to the Credence Table. Hand the additional chalice(s) to the Celebrant. Return to your place. (Exception: when the Deacon is present, she will retrieve the additional chalice to place on the altar. Remain kneeling on your cushion.)

Words of Invitation

23. At "The Gifts of God for the People of God," Rise and move the sanctus bell and cushion to the side so they are not in the way of the clergy and other ministers. Turn toward the communion rail and move the central communion rail and cushion into place. Be sure to end up outside the altar so you can kneel at rail to receive communion.
24. After receiving communion, put your gloves back on, move down the center aisle an appropriate number of rows and turn to face the altar. Invite the congregation to receive communion. Move row by row in order to keep the rail full, but not have communicants standing on the choir steps (for safety) or for the communicants to block the view of the choir (when present) from seeing the organist.

25. When last communicants are at rail, move towards altar. As soon as the last communicants have left rail, move cushion and center rail.
26. Move back to credence table. Celebrant/Deacon may ask for water to cleanse the vessels (ablutions). Take cues from Celebrant/Deacon.
27. When Celebrant/Deacon is vesting the chalice, move the Altar Book from the Gospel (left) side to epistle (right) side.
28. After completing post-communion tasks, return the Sanctus Bell and cushion to their normal places so you can kneel facing the altar for post-communion prayer.

Post-Communion Prayer (kneel)

Closing Hymn (stand)

29. At beginning of Closing Hymn, put your gloves back on and retrieve the candle extinguisher from its stand. Move to the bottom of the altar steps, bow, then extinguish (snuff) candles in this manner:
 - a. Gospel (left) side Office Candles, outer to inner
 - b. Epistle (right) side Office Candles, outer to inner
 - c. Gospel (left) side Eucharistic Candle
 - d. Epistle (right) side Eucharistic Candle
 - e. Left Credence Table candle
 - f. Right Credence Table candle
 - g. (Exception: when the torch bearers are present, before extinguishing the right credence table candle, using the lighter, light the candle lighter from the remaining right Credence Table Candle then snuff out the left Credence Table candle
 - h. Using the fire on the lighter, light the torch bearers' candles
 - i. Extinguish the flame on the lighter and return it to its stand.
 - j. Note: During Eastertide, DO NOT extinguish the Paschal Candle.
30. Move the bottom of the altar steps, bow, and then stand next to the processional cross. Remove the chain holding the cross in the stand, pick up the cross and stand next to the pew until the end of the hymn, blessing and dismissal.
31. After the Blessing and Dismissal move to the opening in the choir stalls (do not bow) and lead the procession down the chancel steps. Unless the Deacon or Celebrant tells you otherwise, you will go down the steps then turn left before the pews and head back toward the vesting room.

After the Service

1. Proceed to vesting room.
2. Neatly hang up cassock and cotta and return acolyte cross to its proper place.
